Hannah was born in Vermont per numerous Census records to John & Alzina (Niles) Wing.

Sometime between 1839 and 1845, the family moved to Ellenburg, Clinton County, New York per the 1850 Census. John's occupation was "Grocery Dealer".

By the 1855 Census, the family had moved again to Greenfield, Sauk County, Wisconsin. Greenfield is located 3 miles east of Baraboo.

In 1860 Census, Hannah was 22 and living on a farm with her parents and younger sister, Asenath J. Warne.

On 28 Dec 1861 in Sauk County, Wisconsin, Hannah married Samuel Warne.

On 17 Sep 1864 in Fairfield, Sauk, Wisconsin, Hannah and Samuel's son Percy L. Warne was born.

Hannah and Samuel had apparently separated by 1870, since Samuel Warne is back living with his parents and no 1870 Census record can be located for Hannah and her son Percy.

On 17 Mar 1874 in Portage, Columbia County, Wisconsin, Samuel Warne remarried to Olive Eulalia Inman, so his marriage to Hannah was definitely over by then.

Two days before he, Hannah's father, John Wing, wills Hannah his farm in Baraboo, Sauk County, Wisconsin.

In the 1880 Census, Hannah and son Percy are living on her father's farm in Baraboo, Sauk County, Wisconsin. Also on the same property is Asenath (Wing) Warne, who has married George Washington Warne, a younger brother of Samuel Warne. (Hannah lists herself as "Widowed" although Samuel is also living elsewhere in Baraboo with his new family working as a "Teamster").

In the 1900 Census, Hannah has moved to Cambria Weston County, Wyoming and is living with her son Percy. Also living in Cambria in the same 1900 Census is her sister Asenath (Wing) Warne with several of her children.

No record can be found of Hannah between 1900 and 23 Nov 1906 when she dies in Denver, CO. However, there is a record of Hannah's son Percy L. Warne in the 1907 Denver, CO City Directory. There is also a record of Percy divorcing his wife "Ethel" in 1908 in Denver, CO, so Hannah was likely living with/near Percy when she died in Nov of 1906.
