"During their years together, the two "buddies" shared their earnings and aided each other in every possible way. If one was hard pressed for money the other was ready and willing to give him any or all of his own.' "Clark, after recovering from the shock of the unexpected death of his friend, said: "We met each other in Denver when we both went to work on a railroad construction project. We got along from the start, with the exception of a few squables over our nationality." "He said they had never been separated for a single day. After saving a sizable stake, Clark became ill and the combined savings went to doctors in his behalf. "I think it was worrying over my condition that caused his death," Clark said.' "Clark refused to remain in bed following his attack, but insisted that the funeral arrangements for his partner be handled by no one but himself." (13).
